Mandatory Reporting of Suspected Child Abuse Quick Reference Guide to Reporting

Under PA Law and Archdiocesan Policy

Any mandated reporter who has reasonable cause to suspect child abuse has occurred is obligated to take the following course of action:

- 1. Make a report to ChildLine by **telephone** at 800-932-0313 or **electronically** at https://www.compass.state.pa.us/CWIS/Public/ReferralsLearnMore, when the child does not appear to be in immediate danger of abuse or harm.
- 2. **Within 48-hours** of telephone reports to ChildLine, you must submit a written CY-47 report with the county Children & Youth services where the alleged abuse took place. The CY-47 may be completed electronically on the Department of Human Services website at compass.state.pa.us/CWIS or downloaded from OCYP's website at childyouthprotection.org. It is not necessary to complete a CY-47 when you have made an electronic report.
- 3. Notify the person in charge of the institution *immediately*. In cases where the suspected abuser is a member of the clergy or a church official, staff person or volunteer, the person in charge of the institution must call the Archdiocese's **Office of Investigations**.
