### Christmas Virtual Learning Plan

We value the enhanced partnership with our parents regarding the monitoring of the health of our students prior to coming back to school. This has been tremendously effective here at Holy Family.

During the upcoming Christmas holiday, we will rely on that partnership even more, particularly as it pertains to travel. We understand that some families need to quarantine prior to travel to visit aging or compromised family members. To facilitate this, we have virtual learning available during this period to make it easier for you. Please communicate with your child's teacher(s) to facilitate this transition. Also, please understand that travelers entering Pennsylvania from other countries and states, as well as Pennsylvanians who are returning home from other countries or states are required to have a negative COVID-19 test within 72 hours prior to entering the Commonwealth or quarantine for 14 days upon return to Pennsylvania.

Archdiocesan policy states that a negative test does not allow for a return from quarantine. If the destination is added to the state list while you are there, even if it was not on the list prior to travel, students would still need to quarantine. If this is in your plans, please let your child's teacher(s) know and plan to pick up all materials prior to your travel.

Another area of concern in which we need your help relates to keeping your child at home if a family member has been exposed to COVID. Moving your child to virtual learning in this situation, can prevent the unnecessary quarantine of other students and provide a safer environment for all.

Traveling to spend time with families is an important activity and one that we value. However, it required additional planning during the pandemic to ensure the safety of all those that travel and those that remain at home.

### Limited Seating at Christmas Masses

As we enter into the Advent Season and begin to anticipate our celebrations of the Birth of Christ, we want to be properly prepared for our parishioners who are planning on participating at one of our Christmas Masses. Christmas Mass will be celebrated on Christmas Eve at 5:00pm and 7:30pm and Midnight. On Christmas Day, Mass will be celebrated at 7:00am, 9:00a.m. and 11:00am.

With regard to our 5:00pm Christmas Eve Mass, very often referred to as the Children's Mass, although Monsignor McCormac will be telling a Christmas story as part of the homily, due to COVID-19, he will not be inviting the children to come forward to join him in the sanctuary. Also, and very importantly, being limited to approximately 200 people for each Mass due to COVID-19, it is respectfully suggested that our parishioners attend one of our other five Masses on Christmas Eve or on Christmas Day.

We are pleased to indicate that we will be live streaming both the 5:00pm Christmas Eve Mass and the 11:00am Christmas Day Mass
